- International comparisons
- Indicator standards
- Parent's demands
- Other TEG standards



- eNewborn, PERISTAT
- Increasing demand
- Interpretation
- Reliable, valid, objective, ...
- Typically overlooked



Challenges

- 1. Accessibility of data
 - 1. Not all relevant data regularly available
 - 2. Need for efficient proxy measures
- 2. Comparability of data
 - 1. Registration procedures
 - 2. Definitions
 - 3. Expectations of health care



Outlook

- 1. Develop links with and create standards for European and international data bases to be able to implement studies on quality of care with "comparable" data
- 2. Close collaboration with other TEGs to see how formal requirements match up to actual application
