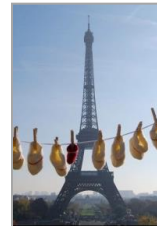

EFCNI's next project:

A new Benchmarking Report to fight inequalities in Europe

- Highlighting changes since 2010
- Raising awareness and understanding for the need of harmonised standards on time with their planned publication
- Assess the current situation and identify needs for improvement
- Starting awareness wave by presenting data and facts, the inequality in Europe and areas where improvements are needed
- Increase pressure on decision makers, e.g. policy makers, hospital administration/CEO, insurances, HCPs etc.



Methodology

- not a scientific or statistical report but policy environment

Desk research

Information and data collection from e.g.:

- Governments,
- Authorities,
- Euro-Peristat
- Scientific literature
- Media reports

Interviews, inquiries/ questionnaires

Topics developed together with Chairs of our Standards of Care project

Carried out with e.g.:

- 10/20 random selected hospitals per country
- National stakeholders (ministries, national societies, experts, families, parent organisations,...)

Expert review and endorsement

Support of messages and findings by societies, organisations, ...

Feedback

Feedback on the report for further explanation and clarification and the preparation of the next edition

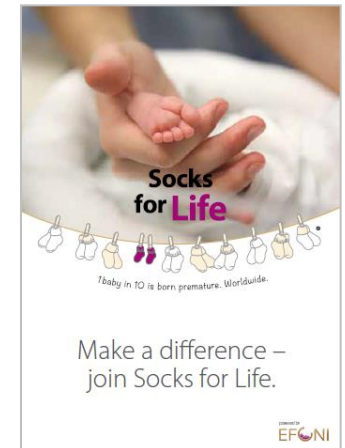
