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How TOP can influence the international variations of fetal death rates?


- Regulations: legal or not? gestational age limit?
- Medical practice for TOP (application of regulation)
- Registration of TOP
 - collection with fetal deaths? specific registry? Or no registration?
- Ability to distinguish TOP in fetal death statistics

Main findings in 2010: Distribution of countries


- No TOP or very rare TOP after the threshold for registration of births (22 or 24 wks): 15 countries
- TOP after this threshold: <u>+</u>15 countries
 - TOP are registered and can be distinguished: 8 countries
 - TOP are registered but cannot be distinguished: 4 countries
 - TOP are not registered: 2 countries

Objectives

- To update our description of the situation
 - new countries
 - new regulations about TOP ?

New description

New countries or new data collection

- Bulgaria, Cyprus, Croatia (regulation, medical practice, registration)
- Still some **uncertainties** in some countries
 - Germany, Denmark, other countries ?

Improvement of data collection

- TOP are included and known in stillbirth statistics in Luxembourg
- TOP are known in stillbirth statistics in Slovenia
- TOP are assessed on all births (N=760,000) in France
- TOP will be known in 2017 in Latvia and in 2018 in Czech Rep

New attitude of parents: TOP without feticide

- Increasing number of parents who do not want a feticide
 - Reported in several countries
- How TOP ending as live birth and neonatal death are registered? (preliminary results from the survey)
 - Neonatal death in Czek Republic, Estonia, France, Italy, Lithuania, Switzerland
 - Is it possible to distinguish these TOP from the other deaths?
 - Abortion in Bulgaria, Finland (Abortion Registry), Norway
 - Stillbirth in Belgium, Cyprus, Latvia
 - Other:
 - TOP are not allowed, or
 - Livebirths are very rare (feticides): Slovenia
